05 Highlights through Q3 for 2025

Successful Launch of Foundation Financial Wellness Program at City Hall with Atlanta Mayor, John Hope Bryant, and more.

L The Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation launches a first-ofits-kind Financial Wellness program designed to assist Atlanta firefighters in building credit, eliminating debt, preparing for homeownership, and accessing long-term financial tools and coaching. This program has been developed in collaboration with Operation HOPE and the City of Atlanta.

06 Impact Portfolio: Key Programs and Initiatives

4 Portfolios and 1 Goal: to increase recruitment and retention for the City of Atlanta Fire Rescue Department

All programs of the Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation are segmented across four impact portfolios that share a common goal of increasing the recruitment and retention rates of the Atlanta Fire Rescue

The four impact portfolios of the Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation include: Education, Housing, Technology and Equipment, and Quality of Life and Wellness.





Education Portfolio

Empowering Educational Success



The Education Impact portfolio consists of programs designed to (1) strengthen recruitment by exposing individuals to the fire service industry and (2) assist sworn members of the Atlanta Fire Rescue Department achieve higher levels of educational achievement and success. Given that for Atlanta firefighters there is a direct relationship between education level and increases in compensation and career advancement opportunities, our education programs reduce the financial burden of tuition and other educational costs, empowering Atlanta firefighters to pursue continuing education opportunities while also enhancing retention efforts for the Atlanta Fire Rescue Department.

Active Programs: The Education Portfolio has three active Programs: Continuing Education (Academic Scholarships), Tuition Reimbursement, and Junior Recruit Program.

Academic Scholarships

The Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation's Continuing Education Program is designed to provide up to \$3,000 in scholarships to sworn firefighters pursuing higher education degrees. The purpose of the program is to support firefighters in furthering their education, enhancing their skills, and promoting leadership within the department. By offering financial assistance, the program helps reduce the barriers to education and encourages professional growth.

Over the past quarter, the Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation awarded 9 additional academic scholarships.

The Foundation intends to award a minimum of \$30,000 in academic scholarships in 2025 for continuing education opportunities to sworn Atlanta Firefighters.

Tuition Reimbursement

The Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation is proud to offer a Tuition Reimbursement Program to support the educational pursuits of firefighters who are not recipients of our academic scholarships. Eligible firefighters who complete at least two academic terms (semesters or quarters) within the same academic year can receive a one-time reimbursement. This reimbursement is provided to help offset the cost of tuition and will be disbursed annually in December.

To date, in 2025, the Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation has awarded \$16,026 to sworn firefighters for continued education opportunities.

Portfolio Improvement

In Q3, the Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation transitioned academic scholarships to a rolling application model allowing firefighters more flexibility to pursue educational opportunities throughout the year without waiting for a single deadline. Additionally, all scholarships are now paid to schools upfront.



Junior Recruit Youth Program

The Junior Recruit Program aims to inspire and empower the next generation of firefighters, emergency responders, and community leaders. With dual enrollment through our education partner, the Atlanta Technical College, participants will earn national certifications, receive experiential training from professional firefighters, and enjoy the benefits of mentorship and fire department - related field trips. The goal of the program is to provide High School Juniors and Seniors with a direct career pathway to enter the Atlanta Fire Rescue Department by exposing students to fire industry insights, experiences, and best learning practices that will foster essential life skills, develop a strong sense of discipline, and build a spirit of resilience and teamwork through immersive firefighter experiences.

Milestone Achievement: As of Q3 2025, 12 students passed the CPAT (Candidate Physical Ability Test) exam as compared to four total students in the last five years. The CPAT is a standardized physical test required to enter the Atlanta Fire Rescue Department that is designed to assess the strength, endurance, and agility needed for firefighting.

Eight of the students who passed the CPAT this year were Seniors who have now entered the recruitment process for AFRD.

The Junior Recruit Program also held its first graduation at Atlanta Technical College on May 12, 2025. The ceremony included 22 graduates.

Volunteerism: Atlanta Fire Rescue firefighters contributed over 72 collective hours of volunteer service to the Junior Recruit Program providing instruction and mentorship to students in the program.

Junior Recruit Youth Program - Testimonials

The Junior Recruit program has been a transformative experience for my son. It instilled a sense of discipline, responsibility, and purpose that I hadn't seen before. Waking up early, maintaining his physical fitness, and working as part of a team gave him structure and pride. Most importantly, it boosted his confidence—knowing he is capable of handling real-life emergency scenarios has changed how he views himself. One of the most powerful moments was the day my son completed and passed the Candidate Physical Ability Test (CPAT). He called me immediately to tell me the good news. I could tell he was proud. When I picked him up, he talked about overcoming some of the challenges he had with the forcible entry activity and how he applied the strategies the professionals had taught them. He was glowing with pride that day.

I am not sure where he will land after this program, but I know that these experiences will impact his decisions post high school. All the lessons we try to push our kids towards in high school: be on time, communicate, do your best, prepare for the future, respect others, set goals, etc. are all at the core of the Junior Recruit program.

Housing Portfolio

Affordable Housing, Rental Relief, and Down Payment Assistance for Atlanta Firefighters



The Housing Impact portfolio consists of programs designed to increase recruitment and retention rates by providing affordable recruit housing units and rental stipends in addition to traditional down payment assistance.

Active Programs: The Housing Portfolio has two active programs: Housing Relief and Down payment Assistance Program.

Housing Relief Program (Stipend)

The Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation's Housing Relief Program is designed to provide stipends for in-city housing for the Atlanta Fire Rescue Department's sworn firefighters. By providing a stipend for in-city residency, the purpose is to enhance public safety and foster stronger relationships between Atlanta's firefighters and their communities. Applicants are eligible for a rental stipend of up to \$1,000 per month based on the applicant's base salary. All stipends are for a maximum of 12 months. The rental property must be located within the corporate city limits of Atlanta, Georgia, and stipend payments will be made directly to the property owner or management company.

Housing Costs and Impact of 2025 Subsidy:

\$172,632 Total Annual Rental Costs of Housing Program Participant Cohort.

\$96,000 Total Annual Projected Rental subsidy provided by Housing Relief Program (which is a 55.6% reduction in total rental costs for the collective cohort.



Portfolio Improvement:

Affordable Housing, Rental Relief, and Down Payment Assistance for Atlanta Firefighters

Portfolio Improvement:

As the Housing Relief Program continues, the goal will be for the Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation to award stipends on a rolling basis granting assistance on a need basis according to available funding.

Milestone Achievement:

As of Q3, the Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation has provided 63 monthly rental assistance payments to Atlanta firefighters.

All participants of the Housing Relief program pilot are currently receiving financial literacy education and training in partnership with Operation Hope.

Recruit Housing Underway: The Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation hosted Atlanta Fire Chief and City Council Members to tour the potential site of a new recruit housing location. Preliminary discussions are in motion around eligibility, furnishings, and rezoning to accommodate the optimal number of AFRD recruits.





Technology and Equipment Portfolio

The Technology and Equipment portfolio consists of programs that increase recruitment and retention rates through a focus on modernization—purchasing essential equipment and introducing newer technologies for the betterment of the Atlanta Fire Rescue Department.

Active Programs: The Technology and Equipment Portfolio has two active programs: The Fire Station Fund and the Innovation and Sustainability Program.



Fire Station Fund

The Fire Station funds creates an avenue for sworn personnel at individual fire stations to select and purchase essential equipment that assist or enhance their daily life at the station. The primary focus of the Fire Station Fund is achieving equity and ensuring that all 36 Atlanta fire stations have access to the same amenities. As a result, our intention is to have every station represented with a minimum of \$5,000 in funding available to them throughout the year. The funding ensures that station houses are equipped with essential equipment like commercial-grade washers and dryers that remove carcinogens from their turnout gear.

Innovation and Sustainability Program:

Technology and data are essential to ensuring that Atlanta Fire Rescue stays on the cutting edge to provide best-inclass firefighting services. As a result, and in alignment with the City of Atlanta's sustainability goals, the Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation's Innovation and Sustainability Program focuses on introducing innovative technologies and electrification to the Atlanta Fire Rescue Department. To date, successes of the program have led to the creation of the pilot and purchase initiative of the Department's first-ever EV quick response vehicles. EV options are considered easier to service and repair than diesel trucks and align with the city's commitment from 2017 to increase the EV readiness of the city and to ensure Atlanta remains a leading city in sustainability.

Milestone Achievement: Unveiled two R1T Rivian vehicles to serve as the first AFRD EV Quick Response Units to deliver emergency medical services to City of Atlanta residents.





Quality of Life and Wellness Portfolio

The Quality of Life and Wellness Impact portfolio consists of programs designed to enhance the physical, mental, and environmental conditions members of the Atlanta Fire Rescue Department experience while on the job. Given the intense nature of their work, our objective is to support our members through the day-to-day hardships related to their careers by creating opportunities that reduce burdens and produce positive outcomes to help them thrive.

Active Programs: The Quality of Life and Wellness Portfolio has three active programs:

- (1) Infrastructure Improvement Program,
- (2) Mental Health and Wellness Program, and
- (3) Injury and Bereavement Program.

Infrastructure Improvement Program:

Given the fact that firefighters on average spend one third of their lives at fire stations serving 24 hour shifts, the Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation has begun performing much needed renovations and improvement projects at fire stations across the City. The range of projects include kitchen and bathroom renovations, cancer prevention initiatives, health and firefighter safety enhancements, lighting installations, electrical upgrades, plumbing enhancements, station safety and communications improvements, HVAC and roofing inspections and more.

110 Scopes of Work.

To date, the Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation working alongside the Atlanta Fire Rescue Department and construction partners, have identified and begun 110 improvement projects across 10 city council districts in the city of Atlanta. Improvements have included but not been limited to: Upgrading bunkroom partitions for privacy, Cancer prevention measures, Gender-neutral bathroom upgrades and Kitchen enhancements.

Over \$2 Million Invested.

Nearly \$2.5 million of vertical funding invested in the Foundation's infrastructural improvement projects to date.

Completion in 18 Months.


70% of all scopes of work identified were completed in the first 12 months. At the end of Q3, over 98% of all scopes of work have been completed.







Mental Health and Wellness Program:



The mental health and wellness of Atlanta firefighters is of the utmost importance. The Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation aims to enhance the mental well-being of our city's first responders through sponsored monthly wellness checks and screenings for sworn firefighters that additionally provide mobility stretching, massage therapy, and food for program participants.

114. Total Number of Firefighters provided wellness services in partnership with the City of Atlanta Public Safety Wellness team.

79 Hours of Massage Therapy.

The Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation has provided over 70 total hours of massage therapy to sworn firefighters through Q3 of 2025.

22 Hours The Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation has provided 22 hours of Mobility Training and Stretching for sworn firefighters through Q3 of 2025.

545 Meals The Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation has provided over 500 total meals to sworn firefighters while sponsoring food for the wellness visits through Q3 of 2025.

Injury and Bereavement Program:

Due to the high risk and dangers associated with the profession of being an Atlanta Firefighter, the Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation aims to assist in times of loss or extreme injury by providing stipends to assist active personnel and families through periods of bereavement, hospitalization, or difficult times.

The program goal, in alignment with the vision of the Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation, is to provide Atlanta-based young professionals with access, resources and a conduit to support Atlanta first responders personally and professionally.

Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation Launches First-of-Its-Kind Financial Wellness Program for Firefighters

Atlanta, GA - April 22, 2025

Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation (AFRF) and Operation Hope announced the official launch of a new financial wellness initiative for Atlanta's firefighters, which will provide free financial coaching, education, and incentives to help firefighters build lasting economic strength. The initiative launch was celebrated on July 24, 2025 at Atlanta City Hall with Money Moves That Matter: A Fireside Chat and Financial Empowerment Experience, an event that brought together civic leaders, public servants, and community stakeholders to spotlight the importance of financial literacy and to offer practical resources to support the over 1,200 members of the Atlanta Fire Rescue Department.

The program is part of AFRF's expanded Quality of Life and Wellness impact portfolio. City of Atlanta Mayor Andre Dickens offered special remarks, and Atlanta Fire Deputy Chief James McLemore welcomed attendees before a featured fireside chat between Operation HOPE Founder and CEO John Hope Bryant and AFRF President and CEO Taos Wynn. Together, they discussed the urgent need for financial literacy in frontline professions and the transformational potential of community-based partnerships. "Firefighters are the heartbeat of our city. They run toward crisis every day. We want to ensure they have the financial tools to protect their own futures while



protecting ours," said Bryant during the discussion.

In addition to inspiration and insight, the event delivered direct financial benefits:

- 10 honorees were awarded \$500 savings accounts
- One sworn and one civilian department member won a month of personalized financial coaching sponsored by Truist Bank
- The first 50 firefighters in attendance received a copy of Bryant's latest bestselling book

The afternoon concluded with a presentation by Yajaira Lugo of Operation HOPE outlining what firefighters can expect from free one-on-one financial coaching, a key component of the newly launched program. The mood throughout the event was festive and forward-looking, with vendor tables, refreshments, and live engagement underscoring the strong community commitment to the financial health of Atlanta's public safety professionals.
